


### Introduction





- 3. Two years Post-Graduate Programme in Assamese, English, Life Sciences and Physics.
  (Four semesters, under Dibrugarh University) \*
- 4. Two years Post-Graduate Programme in Mathematics and Anthropology (Four Semesters, under Assam Science and Technology University, Guwahati).\*

### **Admission Procedure**

- Advertisement for admission to different courses are published in the College website as well as newspapers of Assam.
- 2. Prospectus can be downloaded directly from the College website www.dhsk.org.
- 3. An applicant must submit Application form in the e-samarth portal.
- 4. An applicant willing to apply for more than one MAJOR subject as well as MINOR subject in the Under-Graduate (B. A., B. Sc.) course, must apply using the options available in choosing the next MAJOR subject.
- 5. The list of selected applicants for admission will be uploaded in the college website in due course of time.
- 6. The selected applicants will have to complete the admission procedure by availing fee waiver scheme of Govt. of Assam as applicable or by paying the admission fee in ONLINE mode only as per notification of the Govt. of Assam/college. If anyone fails to fulfil the process, the selection will be cancelled and no claim will be entertained.
- 8. Self-attested copies of all testimonials of the previous examinations whichever applicable are to be submitted and original documents must be produced at the time of interview/admission for verification.
- 9. A candidate seeking admission under the reserved quota (Caste, Culture, Sports, NCC etc.) must submit a self-attested copy of the relevant certificate in support of his / her claim at the time of interview/admission.
- 10. Original Documents required for verification:
- (i) Admit Card and Mark sheet/ Grade sheet of H.S.S.L.C. or equivalent examinations for Undergraduate courses and Admit Card and Mark sheet/ Grade sheet of BA/BSc for Post Graduate courses.
- (ii) Pass Certificates of H.S.S.L.C. or equivalent examinations for Undergraduate courses and Pass Certificate of BA/BSc for Post Graduate courses.
- (iii) Any other relevant Certificate (Caste, Culture, Sports, NCC etc.) if applicable.
- 11. Candidates having Gap Period must submit a court affidavit for the gap period. An applicant passed the qualifying examination prior to 2024 will be admitted as per Dibrugarh University notification.
- 12. Admission will take place on the notified date/time only. The web link will be closed after the stipulated time period.
- 13. The actual fee for admission will be fixed as per government directive(s) and it will be notified in the college website in due course of time.
- 14. An applicant must have her/his own Mobile Number and E-mail IDs and must not change during the entire course of study.
- 15. Applicants seeking Hostel (Boys' & Girls') accommodation have to apply separately and if selected, can take hostel admission on the same date of admission.
- 16. Furnishing any kind of false documents shall invite legal action and may lead to cancellation of her/his admission.

### **After admission (Important Instructions)**

- 1. Every student shall download the App notified by the Principal's Office/concerned Department from Google Play Store and register himself/herself using the same Phone number and e-mail as provided in the ADMISSION FORM, so as to be accessible to the ONLINE Classes.
- 2. Every student must routinely submit the report of attending classes and other activities related to the teaching and learning process through the online DIARY provided to them.
- 3. Every student must submit feedback on teacher(s), facilities and other relevant activities through online App. provided to them.
- 4. For admission, students have to submit the following undertakings:
  - (i) Undertaking on College Rules and Regulations.
  - (ii) Undertaking on Anti-ragging.
  - (iii) Undertaking on Hostel Rules and Regulations.
  - (iv) Undertaking on Environment Consciousness.

### **Identity Card**

An Identity Card will be issued to each student by the college. In the event of loss or damage of a card, a duplicate one will be issued from the Office of the Principal on payment of Rs. 500.00 (Five hundred) only for the same. Students **must wear** their **Identity Cards** in the **college campus**.



### **ANTI-RAGGING GUIDELINES**

Ragging is a disturbing reality in the higher education system of our country. Despite the fact that over the years, ragging has claimed hundreds of innocent lives and has ruined the careers of thousands of bright students, the practice is still perceived by many as a way of 'familiarisation' and an 'initiation into the real world' for young college-going students.

The Ragging is defined as any disorderly conduct, whether by words spoken or written or by an act, has the effect of teasing, treating, or handling with rudeness a fresher or a junior student. Indulging in a rowdy or undisciplined activity that causes or is likely to cause annoyance, hardship, or psychological harm or to raise fear or apprehension thereof in a fresher or junior student. Asking the students to do any act or perform something that such students will not do in the ordinary course and which has the effect of causing or generating a sense of shame or embarrassment so as to adversely affect the physique or psyche of a fresher or junior student. This can lead to adverse effects such as depression, anxiety, and sometimes even suicide.



Any student or group of students found guilty of ragging on campus or off campus shall be liable to one or more of the following punishments:

- · Debarring from appearing in any sessional test/university examination or withholding results
- · Suspension from attending classes and academic privileges
- · Withdrawing scholarships and other benefits
- · Suspension from the college for a period of one month
- · Cancellation of admission
- Debarring from representing the institution in any national or international meet, tournament, youth festival, etc.
- · Suspension/expulsion from the hostel
- Rustication from the institution for periods varying from 1 to 4 semesters or equivalent period
- · Expulsion from the institution and consequent debarring from admission to any other institution
- · Fine up to twenty five thousand rupees
- Imprisonment for a term which may extend to two years or with fine which may extend to ten thousand rupees or both.

Collective punishment - When the students committing or abetting the crime of ragging are not identified, the institution shall resort to collective punishment as a deterrent to ensure community pressure on the potential raggers. Any institution that fails to take adequate steps to prevent ragging or fails to act in accordance with the Regulations or fails to punish perpetrators or incidents of ragging suitably is liable to the penalties and punishments as per the provisions of the Regulations.

### General Code of Conduct

- 1. Students shall be responsible for their conduct in the college and are prohibited from doing any activities which can defame the name of the College (either inside or outside the campus), that will amount to a breach of discipline, or cause of interference in the discipline and normal functioning of the college.

- 3. Ragging in any form in the college is strictly prohibited and any student found indulging in such activity shall invite disciplinary and legal action.
- 4. The students must abide by all rules and regulations as prescribed by the College Authority.

- 6. Punitive measure will be initiated against a student of the college if he/she uses the platform of **Social Media** to abuse/ scold/affront students/ faculty members/others and he/she will face **Legal Action**.
- 7. No student will be allowed to gossip on WhatsApp group against College Authority and any student found involved in such activity shall invite **Disciplinary Action**. If a student have any complaint, he/she must communicate with the College Authority directly.
- 8. As the College is a Green Audited College therefore, no student is allowed to bring any Motor Vehicles (Two Wheelers and Four Wheelers) to the College Campus. Violation of which will invite disciplinary action.
- Students wishing to contest in the Students Union Election are required to submit a Certificate of No Objection from their parents.

### **Attandance Rules**

- Students are required to attend all classes as per Dibrugarh University regulation (lectures / tutorials/practical).
- Students with less than 70% attendance of the classes shall not be allowed to appear in the end semester examinations.
- Students with less than 80% attendance of the classes shall not be allowed to appear in the election of the Students' Union Society.

## FOUR YEAR UNDERGRADUATE PROGRAMMES (FYUGP) IN CBCS (Arts and Science)

### (i) UG Certificate programme:

UG Certificate Programme leads to a UG certificate after completing 1 year (2 semesters) of study in the chosen fields of study. Students on exit shall be awarded UG certificate (in the Field of Study/Discipline) after securing the requisite 44 Credits on completion of Semester II if, in addition, they complete one work based/skill based vocational course/internship of 4 credits within one year from the completion of 2nd semester examination. These students are allowed to re-enter the degree programme within a period of three years and complete the degree within the stipulated maximum period of seven years.

### (ii) UG Diploma Programme:

UG Diploma Programme leads to a UG diploma after 2 years (4 semesters) of study in the chosen fields of study. Students on exit shall be awarded UG Diploma (in the Field of Study/Discipline) after securing the requisite 88 Credits on completion of Semester IV if, in addition, they complete one work based/skill based vocational course/internship of 4 credits within one year from the completion of 4th semester examination. These students are allowed to re-enter the degree programme within a period of three years and complete the degree within the maximum period of seven years.

(iii) Three Year UG Degree Programme (BA & BSc) with major:

Students who wish to undergo a 3-year (6 semester) UG programme shall be awarded UG degree in the Major discipline after successful completion of three years, securing a minimum of 132 credits.

(iv) Four-Year UG Programme with honours (BA and BSc) with major:

Students who wish to undergo a 4-year (8 semester) UG programme shall be awarded UG Honours degree in the Major discipline after successful completion of four years, securing a minimum of 176 credits.

(v) Four Year UG Programme with honours with Research (BA and BSc) with major:

Students who wish to undergo a 4-year (8 semester) UG programme shall be awarded UG Honours and research degree in the Major discipline after successful completion of four years with a rigorous research project, securing a minimum of 176 credits.

### **Key words:**

- a) **Programme:** The term 'programme' is used to mean the whole learning experience or combination of courses pursued for a Certificate, Diploma or a Degree.
- b) **Course:** A "Course" means one of the specified units which goes to comprise a programme of study.
- c) Academic Year: An 'Academic Year' means a period of twelve months consisting of two semesters.
- d) **Semester:** The word "semester" is used to mean a half-yearly term or term of studies including examinations, vacations and semester breaks.
- e) **Semester Duration:** A semester normally extends over a period of 15 class weeks. Each week has 30 hours of instruction spread over the week.
- f) In-semester: The word "in-semester" is used to refer to the continuous evaluation within the half-yearly term.
- g) **End-semester:** The word "end-semester" is used to refer to the terminal processes of examinations and evaluations at the end but within the half-yearly term.
- h) Credit: A 'credit' is a unit by which the coursework is measured. It determines the number of hours of instruction required per week over the duration of a semester (minimum 15 weeks). A course may have only a lecture component or a lecture and tutorial component or a lecture and practicum component or a lecture, tutorial and practicum component, or only practicum component. - i) Academic Bank of Credits (ABC): 'Academic Bank of Credits (ABC)' is an academic service mechanism as a digital/virtual/online entity established and managed by MOE/UGC to facilitate students to become its academic account holders and paving the way of seamless student mobility, between or within degree-granting Higher Education Institutions through a formal system of credit recognition, credit accumulation, credit transfers and credit redemption to promote distributed and flexible teaching learning.
- j) Academic Flexibility: 'Academic Flexibility' is the provision for innovative and interchangeable curricular structures to enable creative combinations of Courses/Programmes in disciplines of study leading to Certificate/Diploma/Degree of study offering multiple entry and multiple exit facilities removing the rigid curricular boundaries and creating new possibilities of life-long learning.
- k) Credit accumulation: 'Credit Accumulation' means the facility created by ABC in the Academic Bank Account opened by the students across the country in order to transfer and consolidate the 'credits' earned by them by undergoing 'courses' in any of the eligible HEIs.
- l) **Credit recognition:** 'Credit Recognition' means the credits earned through eligible/partnering HEIs and transferred directly to the ABC by the concerned HEIs.
- m) Credit redemption: 'Credit redemption' means the process of commuting the accrued 'credits' in the Academic Bank Account of the students maintained in ABC for the purpose of fulfilling the 'credits requirements' for the award of Certificates/Diplomas/Degrees etc. by the degree awarding HEIs.
- m) Credit transfer: 'Credit transfer' means the mechanism by which the eligible HEIs registered with ABC are able to receive or provide prescribed 'credits' to individual registered ABC account in adherence to the UGC credit norms for the 'course/s' registered by the desirous students in any HEIs within India.
- n) Course teacher: A 'Course teacher' is a teacher or any person who is engaged by the University/College/Institute for teaching a Course. He/ she shall perform the following functions:
  - (a) Teaching the Course approved by the statutory authorities.
  - (b) Maintaining attendance and performance records of all the students registered for the Course(s) he/she teaches.
  - (c) Conducting In-semester Assessment (Internal Assessment)
  - (d) Involving himself/herself in preparation and moderation of question papers, evaluation, scrutiny and finalization of results of the course(s) etc. whenever needed.
  - (e) Participating in various curricular and co-curricular activities as and when necessary.
  - (f) Preparing syllabus of different Courses whenever necessary.



The students on exit shall be awarded Undergraduate Diploma (in the Field of Study/Discipline) after securing the requisite 88 Credits on completion of Semester IV provided they secure additional 4 credit in skill based vocational courses offered during First Year or Second Year summer term or internship/Apprenticeship

### **Admission Criteria:**

Minimum eligibility for admission into Four-Year Undergraduate Programmes (**Bachelor of Arts/Science**): A candidate passed the HS Examination of the Assam Higher Secondary Education Council, or an equivalent examination (10+2) recognized as such by the University.

### **Reservation Policy:**

Statutory reservation policy of the Govt. of India and Govt. of Assam shall be followed in case of selection of eligible candidates for admission.

### Rules for In-semester Assessment in FYUGP


- 1. In in-semester assessment, different tools such as objective tests, written tests, assignments, paper presentation, laboratory work, etc. suitable to the courses may be employed.
- 2. The students shall be informed in advance about the nature of assessment. Students shall be required to compulsorily attend in-semester assessment including appearing the sessional tests, failing which they will not be allowed to appear for the End-semester examination. A Student cannot repeat In-semester examinations. The Department/Centre for Studies may arrange special in-semester examination whenever necessary.
- 3. The (20%) marks allotted for In-Semester Assessment in each course shall be based on the following:
  - a) One Internal Examination (Sessional Examination): 50% of the marks allotted for In-Semester Assessment.
  - b) Others (any one or more) Seminar Presentation/ Assignment/ Group Discussion/ Quiz/ Viva-Voce: 50 % of the marks allotted for In-Semester Assessment.

### Four Year Undergraduate Programme in Self-financing Subjects:

Computer Science, Education, Psychology and Sociology are the self-financing subjects in the Four-Year Undergraduate Programme (FYUGP).

If a candidate opts any of the above-mentioned subjects, he/she must pay Rs. 6000/- (Rupees Six Thousand only) as self-financing course fee for each Academic Year.




